"Wellness & Your Bottom Line" Attracts Those Looking to Save Members learn how to invest in their employees, while reducing their bottom line

Healthcare consumers are paying for lifestyle choices, not genetic diseases, stressed Todd Phillips, M.D., Hanover Hospital, a panelist for the "Wellness and Your Bottom Line - A Healthcare Symposium."



Attendees listen as a member from the panel demonstrates the best way to implement a wellness program into the workplaces.

Held last month, the Symposium featured a panel of three insurance companies and Dr. Phillips. Discussions focused on wellness programs, cost containment, disease management and education.

"Employers have to own their wellness program. It has to be owned by you; run by you," said moderator Dan Day, CEBS, President, StoudtAdvisors.

In addition to the panel discussion, George Kyriacou, President & CEO, Hanover Hospital, stressed that healthcare costs are increasing beyond what we can afford. "The best way to motivate

employees in a wellness program is through incentives," he said.

John Bartman, VP of Human Resources, Snyder's of Hanover, agreed. "We

provide monetary and trinket incentives for our employees. It works."

In addition to incentives, each presenter and panelist stressed that an employer will not see a return on investment until about year three. It is important to adopt a wellness program for the long run.

This session was presented by the Hanover Chamber Healthcare Plan, StoudtAdvisors and Hanover Hospital, and will be "just one of several that we will hold," said Gary Laird, President, Hanover Chamber. "Our members are interested in how they can save money and have healthy employees."
