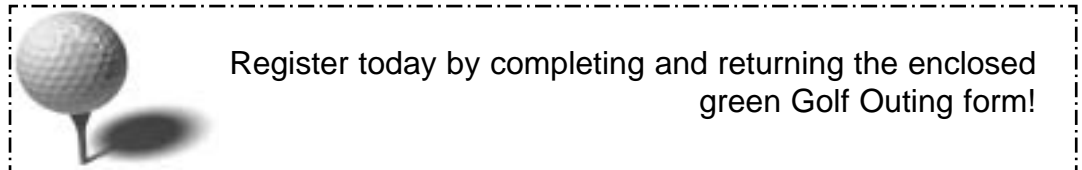

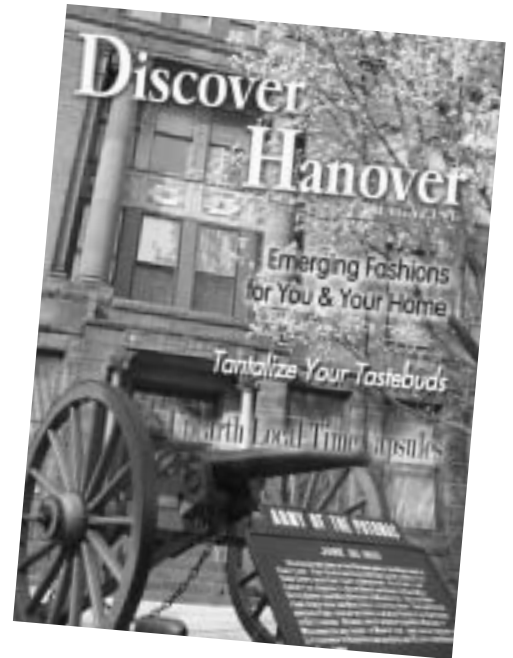
"Discover Hanover" replaces the Chamber's bi-annual Membership

Brothers Glenn and Fred Bailey founded Bailey Travel Service in April 1949, after Glenn had spent years arranging train tours to New York City. Together, the brothers ran the business until the late 1970s, when they passed the torch to Fred's son, John Bailey.

John began his career in the travel business as early as age 12, when he took his first assignment on a solo train trip to New York City to secure a Chinese Entry Visa for a client. All these years later, he still has the expense receipt he turned in to his father following the trip.

In addition to running Bailey Travel, John started its sister company, Bailey Coach, in 1998. Today, he is president of both, and has a staff of 14; 40 percent of whom have been with him for over 20 years.

The dedication and loyalty of its employees has helped Bailey Travel to become one of the leading travel agencies in Central PA.

Bailey Travel services both local and national corporate accounts, and plans vacations and group trips, many of which John escorts himself. The business is large enough to handle the most particular clients, yet small enough to care about every last detail. In 60 years, annual sales have grown from \$15,000 to \$12.5 million.

Thriving in its second generation of ownership, John hopes to see the success continue into a third generation, when his daughter, Courtney, joins the family business. Courtney is scheduled to graduate in 2010 from Bloomsburg University.

## *Certifichек Instructions*

The Hanover Chamber was notified the end of February that Certifichекs, Inc. is in the process of filing Chapter 7 bankruptcy in Dayton, Ohio.

Because the Hanover Chamber stands behind the programs it provides, it will reimburse purchasers of Certifichекs for those issued between February 26, 2008 and February 26, 2009. The Chamber will redeem checks dated as indicated above through August 31, 2009. The Chamber will not redeem any checks after August 31, 2009.

In addition, the Chamber will reimburse any participating member businesses that had Certifichекs returned from the bank.

Checks ordered through the Chamber office are eligible for reimbursement. Please read the steps below for details.

### **Steps for Reimbursement:**

-Mail or drop off the original Certifichек(s) to the Chamber. Please make copies for your records.

-You will receive a Hanover Chamber bank check in the amount of your Certifichек via mail. The Chamber will cut reimbursement checks monthly.

-Please note that the Chamber will not provide any kind of reimbursement without the original Certifichек. Photocopies will not be accepted. The Chamber is not responsible for lost reimbursement checks.

The Hanover Chamber is committed to supporting its members and appreciates everyone's patience during this difficult time. Like many businesses, the Chamber is experiencing a challenging year in today's economy. However, the Chamber believes that refunding bearers of Certifichекs is the right thing to do, and will fund this reimbursement out of its operating budget.

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## Hanover Trolley Trail Marks Opening with Ribbon Cutting

The Hanover Portion of the York-Hanover Trolley Trail officially opened on April 22nd at the Moul Field Complex in Hanover. A grand opening celebration was held, featuring a ribbon cutting, guest speakers, and refreshments courtesy of on the Go Cafe. The event

closed with walk along the trail into the downtown area.

Guest speakers included Heidi Hormel, Rail Trail Authority Member; Steve Chronister, York County Commissioner; Art Smith, President, Hanover Public School Board; Carl Knoch, President, York County Rail Trail Authority; and Tim Fulton and Dr. Thomas Howard, co-chairs, Trail Links, Capitol Campaign.

The York Hanover Trolley Line operated as a passenger trolley line from 1908 until 1939. Following the decline of trolley service, the line was purchased as a right of way for electricity transmission lines. In 1977, York County adopted a Metropolitan Bike Route Plan, and, in that same year, the County of York established a non-motorized recreational trail from Hokes Mill Rd. in West Manchester Township to Wilson Ave. in Penn Township, following the trolley lines.

Phase 1 Construction of the Hanover Trolley Trail began in June, 2008. The trail now includes a parking lot/trailhead

at the Jackson Township Sewer Authority Plant, approximately one mile of trail, and a small parking area near Hosiery Alley in the Spring Grove Borough. In Hanover Borough, a 1.25 mile trail was completed from Moul to Wilson Avenues, along with signage of 'on-the-road' portions of the trail.



The Hanover Trolley Trail will eventually connect to the completed trail in Jackson Township, Spring Grove.

A study will be conducted in 2009 to further investigate the development of additional sections of the historic trolley line. For more information, visit [yorkcountytails.org](http://yorkcountytails.org).

### Hanover Chamber to Apply for Accreditation

Every five years, the Hanover Chamber applies for accreditation through the U.S. Chamber's Accreditation Program, the only national program that recognizes chambers for effective organizational procedures and outstanding contributions toward positive change in their communities.

The purpose of the U.S. Chamber's Accreditation Program is to facilitate continuing excellence in the chamber industry and to foster a pro-business environment across America.

The Hanover Chamber is currently rated with a three-star accreditation.

### What exactly is Accreditation?

The Accreditation Program defines standards of excellence in chamber planning and performance and shows chambers how they can reach and maintain these standards. It also helps chambers measure achievement while recognizing and encouraging chamber members and staff who meet high standards of operation and who contribute effectively to the good of their chambers and communities.

The criteria and standards used in the guidelines become tools for management control and self-discipline—guiding the organization by helping it upgrade and improve its basic effectiveness. Chambers that have earned Accreditation value the process as a worthwhile experience. It has helped them focus attention on the
